Student Missionary Corp

This weekend we will be having a training day for our student missionaries for next year. We will have 20 Students joining us!

These students are the "heartbeat" of our community on campus. They pray into our ministries and are involved in conversations about mission. These are the leaders of the leaders in many ways.

Bible Studies

Bible studies directly impact an estimated **200 students** on this campus.

As we approach next year we are continuing to invite students into leadership in this ministry.

Our goal is for new students living on campus next year to have access to a bible study in their dorm.

Formation

Our Formation program this year has approximately 70 student involved. Every other Thursday we all gather to hear teaching on Christian Living and to pray together.

This semester we are going through the Emotions Course. We are talking about emotions like *anger*, *fear*, *love and desire*. Students are each in a small group with their peers being led by a mission leader or member of the Cornerstone community in Columbus. In small groups, students can dive deeper into the teachings presented as well as what the Lord is speaking in prayer.

Our formation community has been growing a lot this year in our prayer together. Students are learning to exhort, lead prayer and music, and to share words from the Lord. There has been a great theme in our prayer

this year of the Lord's desire to renew our worship. *As we worship, we live our lives*



Households

Our households continue to go well. It's difficult to believe that we will all be heading separate ways in one short month. These past few weeks have been a true **refining of charity** in our relationships. Throughout this second semester there has been a lot of opportunity for faithfulness in loving one another and in continuing to deepen relationships.

Many of our household students are graduating this year: some to enter the work force, and 5 to serve full time (3-4 with SPO)!

This summer we will be having a household program for our students that will be headed up by a few of our student leaders!

I plan to continue to work with SPO next year, so this summer I will begin training June 23rd and remain in MN for a summer household program until July 3. Our second training will begin at the end of July. I will be spending the rest of my time working on support raising and visiting with family.
